Modern surrealist artist Vincent Fink is all about **EXPANSION** and reiterating his work into something newer, more refined, getting ever closer towards perfection. All through his art, Fink aspires to elicit an undeniable feeling of reverie for knowledge and exude a state of balance. Fink's new series the <u>ITERATIONS</u> are acrylic geometrical paintings that portray the unification of matters in an organized and intertwined form. Fink's intent with his series is to display a sense of interconnectivity, elevating vibrations of peace, joy, and harmony. Sacred geometry is a subject that prevails in his work because according to Fink, "everything is geometrically interconnected, from specks of dust, to tiny ants, to human beings, to the milky way galaxy."

Some of Fink's favorite artists are M.C. Escher - an ultimate favorite, Rene Magritte who has been an influence on his paintings and surrealist artist, Salvador Dali. Fink studied graphic design at the Art Institute of Houston and although his fine art career started off as an illustrator, he is most familiarized with drawing in pencil. His art is a continuous evolving combination of drawings, graphic design, paintings, and street art. Fink is well known for his captivating murals located at The Silos at Sawyer Yards. "The mural project was a big undertaking given the fact that it was a complete different process, it was a larger scale, it took more time, more paint, it was definitely more challenging," says Fink.

Tackling this new year, Fink plans to eliminate distractions. And as a man of many hats it is important for him to focus. He has taken a step further by co-founding <u>POINT506</u> along with his wife, co-founder Tina. POINT506 is an emblem of Fink's screen-printed artwork and a Houston-based indie clothing line. "The whole idea was to create a classy and science inspired apparel," explains Fink. He envisions to expand his clothing line in shops all over the U.S., Europe, and other countries in the near future. Without setting any limitations, he expects to see his art in more art galleries and museums. **The sky is NOT the limit,"** is Fink's motto. "We've already gone beyond the sky. That's just the start." Fink plans big, not small.

#VincentFinkArt: I believe in paranormal apparitions and as far as ghosts, I think they're more like echos stuck in a ripple of time.

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
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
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
